



CAREER SERVICES

The administration and faculty of the College take an active interest in the future of the graduates. There is a cooperative effort to assist prospective graduates in choosing a career, in gaining admission to and obtaining financial assistance and scholarships for graduate and professional school, and in securing interviews and opportunities for employment.

Students have the primary responsibility for planning for their future, and the College's Career Center has a library of graduate and professional school information to help in the process. A Career Counselor provides one-on-one counseling with students in their employment and graduate school searches and arranges career talks throughout the year during which students learn about opportunities in various professions. In addition, chaplains schedule discernment evenings throughout the year for those considering a vocation to the priesthood and/or religious life.
